ERG Walk, Saturday 12th September 2009 (Historic Churches Day)

A varied 5 mile mostly flat walk, possibly muddy in places after rain. The walk includes part of the Severn Way to Deerhurst where King Canute and King Edmund came in 1016 to sign a treaty to divide England into Saxon and Danelaw. We visit two Anglo Saxon churches, St Mary's Church, Deerhurst, founded pre 804, "one of the finest and most complete buildings in England to survive from before the Norman Conquest" and Odda's Chapel which dates from the early 11th Century.

Meet at the Coal House Inn, <u>Apperley</u>, on the banks of the Severn, at 9.45 am to order food prior to a 10.00 start. Please use car park away from the river on the Apperley side of pub.

Location – OS 854283 – approach from Cheltenham via A4019 Tewkesbury direction to Coombe Hill. At lights, turn right onto the A38 and then left at next traffic lights on B4213. Take second right turn to Apperley Village. At village centre take Gabb Lane downhill towards the river. The Coal House pub is at the end of this road.
