
Bubbs Hill Closure

News From The Trust

Throughout 2020 the Trust, supported hugely by the community, has coped well with the COVID19 pandemic. Unfortunately, however there are at present about 25% more COVID patients in hospital than at the peak of the first wave, but the numbers in critical care are not as high as previously. The staff continue to give their all but, not unexpectedly, are feeling the strain.

The end of the year saw the release of a COVID vaccine & the Trust is one of the 50 hubs that will oversee the distribution of the vaccine in the first phase. A matter of celebration is that on the 17th December the Prince of Wales & the Duchess of Cornwall visited the Trust & formally named the Hub 'The Edward Jenner COVID19-Vaccination Hub' in honour of Edward Jenner, Gloucestershire's pioneering scientist & inventor of vaccines.

Despite all the difficulties faced because of the efforts of every member of staff, together with close collaboration with our partners in the Gloucestershire Integrated Care System ICS, it has been possible to continue with urgent & cancer elective activity. This has also been helped by the planned allocation of work between the two hospital sites.

Working together with the ICS will increase over 2021 to deliver the vision of how high-quality health & care services can be sustainably delivered in the future. This will include greater emphasis on prevention of illness, support for more self-care, joined up care & support in the community & quality improvements for hospital services. As part of this, a forward-thinking application was put in for a £39.5m grant for hospital improvement, which was successful. This will be used to provide Cheltenham General Hospital with two new theatres & an additional day surgery unit. This will offer additional operating capacity in purpose-built facilities that will improve patient & staff experience by enabling more efficient working, reduced waiting lists, & fewer cancelled operations. Gloucestershire Royal Hospital will have an improved emergency department (ED), improved acute medical facilities for faster

diagnosis, assessment & treatment, redesigned outpatients & fracture clinic accommodation for orthopaedic patients, additional x-ray capacity & ward refurbishments.

Another exciting prospect for 2021 is that, with the relationship with partner University of Gloucestershire (UoG) continuing to go from strength to strength, two more exciting developments are in prospect. Work has been undertaken taken to develop an Operating Department Practitioner (ODP) degree which will take its first intake in January & offers both traditional & apprenticeship pathways. Work is also on track to establish a degree programme for biomedical scientists that will see the UoG & Trust delivering degrees in all the main healthcare disciplines, except for medical training.

Over the last year there have been 'big conversations' about staff & patient experience covering many aspects of staff & patient wellbeing. For governors one of the main concerns that we hear relates to the treatment of patients who present with mental health issues, either as a current concern in ED or as an ongoing hidden disability. It is therefore really pleasing that this has now become a major priority. Constructive dialogue is taking place & together with specific provisioning being made in ED hopefully 2021 will see this aspect of care improved enormously.

Finally, all the Fit For the Future programme consultations will be completed in 2021 & hopefully the Trust will be able to work on establishing Centres of Excellence & will be well on the road on our Journey to Outstanding.
