

News from Gloucestershire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

The concern over ambulance delays is still with us in Gloucestershire, and of course it's a nation-wide problem. Last month, though, GHNHSFT's own Chief Executive Deborah Lee experienced symptoms that suggested a stroke. Her husband, aware of her concern about the ongoing issue



around ambulances, chose to drive her directly to the hospital. Happily, she has now recovered after initial urgent treatment and then a trip to Oxford to have a clot removed. As soon as she was able to, Deborah tweeted her thanks to those who cared for her, adding, 'but I can't get one thing out of my head. What if my husband hadn't been there and my daughter had called for an ambulance, and I'd been put in the Cat 2 "stack"?' Her story, relayed by Deborah in an insightful and honest way that is typical of her, attracted national interest and an outpouring of supportive responses, including the following:

'You've turned a heartening message of personal recovery into a powerful call to arms."

'The call to arms around ambulance services & hospital 'back door' inc. Social Care so desperately needed too. NHS needs more CEOs demanding Govt action.'

'Ambulance response times are a whole system issue including primary, acute, community & social care. A proper funded plan to develop the social care workforce would be top of my list too!'

Update on A417

The Development Consent Order (DCO) Examination for the A417 missing link ended on 16 May 2022. The Planning Inspectorate now have three months to submit their recommendation to the Department for Transport, with a final decision being made around November 2022.

National Highways has awarded the construction company Kier a £430m contract to design and deliver the A417 Missing Link scheme. If there is a positive decision in November It is anticipated that work will start in spring 2023.
