News from the Parish Council

The proposed Air Balloon 'no-right-turn' trial has been cancelled.

Many individuals and at least ten parish councils had been making their views known to their District and County Councillors, to the MP for the Cotswolds, and to the highways Agency. The issue, and the significant local opposition to it, has been covered in the media, both press and TV. In early February, Cheltenham Borough Council resolved not to support the trial, and a motion against the trial was to be put to a full meeting of Cotswold District Council at the end of February. On Tuesday 19th February, the County Council issued a press statement indicating it was withdrawing its support for the trial, and later the same day, the Highways Agency announced it would not be going ahead. Local campaigning will now be seeking to persuade the Highways Agency to implement a 'proper' and long-term solution to the problems of the A 417 'missing link'. Lois - 870375

Nature Notes

The first signs of Spring are evident and won't be deterred by any future cold snap. Apart from the snowdrops, and the daffodil heads just showing a hint of pale yellow, the piercingly sweet song of the robin is a heart lifting sound – really showing that winter is on the turn. Blackbirds, song thrushes and robins are the first of the birds to nest and already the male blackbirds are demonstrating their territorial dances and creating noisy havoc amongst the borders! In Elkstone there may be a few adult peacock butterflies emerging from hibernation on warmer days

If you have a compost heap, take care where you plunge your garden fork, as about now the frogs and newts will be emerging from the warmth of the heap and heading for the nearest pond. One frog failed to achieve the water and as he crawled across our lawn was attacked by a jackdaw. The call of Spring is not always pretty!
