This month snakes seem to have come to my notice. A farmer with a forklift was moving a manure heap when he realized he had snakes in his heap. Not wishing to hurt or disturb them, he tipped his load near a hedge where he thought they would be safe. When he looked again they were busy crawling back to the original heap. Can snakes feel homesick? Not long afterwards a snake was in the porch of a local church and was transferred in a dustpan to another place. Not only homesick but fond of Harvest Festival Produce?

All these were grass snakes. Adders are sometimes seen on the steep field along Cockleford Lane in Spring sunning themselves on ant heaps and other warm places. There are so many things we don't know about wild creatures.
