5. Correspondence from the Parish

5.1 – verbal report – continuing concern re trees beside r.byway BEL 12

The landowner was previously alerted to this concern, and had the trees inspected. Six or seven of them now bear small identity discs. No further action by EPC.

- **5.2** verbal report noise nuisance gas cannon bird scarer in close proximity to some houses, residents describe the gas cannon as so loud, it's like being under siege.
- Mr. Hobbs opined that the growing season during which it is of benefit has almost ended, so anticipated that it would shortly be removed. No action by EPC.
- **5.2** e-mail a repeated complaint re water still flowing down the lane across The Pound. Clerk confirmed that Thames Water has searched for, but not found, a mains leak, and is testing to check that the water is natural, not mains.

Gloucestershire Highways has been alerted to the parishioner's further complaint. No further action by EPC.
